## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

WOF = Width of fabric | *Sew strips via short ends, then subcut as indicated in pattern


BLOCK ASSEMBLY: Refer to BLOCK DIAGRAM

## BLOCK DIAGRAM

1. Sew (1) A1 piece to left side of $C 3^{\prime \prime}$ square, press, then sew (1) A2 piece to top and press.
2. Sew (1) D1 piece to right side, press, then sew (1) D2 piece to bottom and press.
3. Sew (1) G1 piece to left side, press, then sew (1) G2 piece to top and press.
4. Sew (1) F1 piece to right side, press, then sew (1) F2 piece to bottom.
5. Sew (1) E1 piece to left side, press, then sew (1) E2 piece to top and press.
6. Sew (1) B1 piece to right side, then sew (1) B2 piece to bottom and press. Square to $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, make (42) blocks.

QUILT ASSEMBLY: Refer to QUILT DIAGRAM for proper block placement and rotation.
7. Sew blocks together into rows, then sew rows together.


BLOCK (make 42)


BORDER ASSEMBLY: Measure width and length of quilt top to ensure border cutting sizes. Below are our measurements
8. Sew (1) G 2-1/2" $X\left(70-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ strip to each side of quilt, then sew (1) G $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} X\left(64-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ strip to top and bottom of quilt.

## FINISHING:

Cut batting and backing $3^{\prime \prime}$ larger than top on all sides. Layer backing, batting and top together and baste or pin. When quilting is completed, trim excess batting and backing. Bind with $\mathbf{G}$ fabric.
